

Community Meeting for the Proposal to Close Robert Emmet Elementary School

CPS Presentation

Adam Anderson, Officer, Portfolio Planning and Strategy, welcomed those in attendance and opened the meeting. Mr. Anderson introduced the court reporter, note-taker, Spanish language interpreter, sign language interpreter and CPS / CPD officials in attendance. Mr. Anderson then shared the date, time, and location of future meetings and provided an overview of the handout distributed to the attendees. Mr. Anderson then described the public comment ground rules and opened the public comment period.

Brief Summary and Public Comment

The purpose of the meeting was to receive public comments on the proposal to close Emmet Elementary School in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-230. There were approximately 15 community members in attendance and 3 speakers:

Bonita Robinson

Ms. Robinson shared excerpts from an article written by Linda Darling-Hammond that discussed the positive gains in closing the achievement gap before the most recent reform efforts, which has included school closures. She stated that these reforms have not helped to address the achievement gap. She state that this article has been provided to the Board of Education. Ms. Robinson then recited a poem titled *What Shall I Tell My Children Who are Black*.

Akeisha Williams, Teacher

Ms. Williams stated her opposition to the proposed closure and shared recent performance data for Emmet Elementary School, which she stated is higher than a charter school in the area. She also discussed the lack of resources available to the school.

Latrice Jamison, Parent / LSC Chair

Ms. Jamison stated her opposition to the proposed closure. She shared that she had attempted to enroll a child at Ellington in the past but was turned away and is not clear why her children will now be able to attend the school. Ms. Jamison also shared recent performance data for Emmet Elementary School.
